This starts at 1000, followed by our Class meeting at Mitscher Hall from 1115-1200. I am going to give a brief chat about the state of our Class and things we have planned down the road. After that, I have the honor to turn the mic over to the Navy's Old Goat and classmate and 11th Company member, Admiral Stuart Munsch for the 2nd half of our Class meeting.

Here is Stuart's biography: Stuart Benjamin Munsch[1] (born 1962)[2] is a United States Navy admiral who serves as the commander of United States Naval Forces Europe-Africa and commander of Allied Joint Force Command Naples since 27 June 2022.[3] He most recently served as the director for joint force development, J7, of the Joint Staff from 2020 to 2022.[4][5][6]

- Munsch is also the Navy's Old Goat, the longest serving United States Naval Academy graduate on active duty, having received the title and accompanying decanter from John C. Aquilino on 26 June 2024.[7]
- Munsch was assigned to four consecutive sea duty assignments, serving on USS Will Rogers (SSBN-659), USS
  Jefferson City (SSN-759), USS Kitty Hawk (CV-63) on the staff of commander, Cruiser Destroyer Group 5, and USS
  Tucson (SSN-770). In 1999, Munsch reported ashore to U.S. Pacific Command, where he served in the Plans and
  Policy Directorate (J5) prior to becoming deputy executive assistant to the commander. He then was selected for a
  White House Fellowship and served as special assistant to the Secretary of Agriculture.
- Munsch commanded USS Albuquerque (SSN-706) from 2002 to 2005, followed by duty in the Pentagon as the military assistant to the Deputy Secretary of Defense and then as executive assistant to the director, submarine warfare, Office of the Chief of Naval Operations (OPNAV N87).
- Munsch commanded Submarine Development Squadron (DEVRON) 5 from 2008 to 2010 and then returned to the Pentagon to head the Navy Strategy branch (OPNAV N513). Selected for flag rank, he was reassigned as deputy director, undersea warfare (OPNAV N97).
- Sent overseas to Japan and Bahrain, Munsch commanded Submarine Group 7 and Task Forces 74 and 54 from 2013 to 2015, followed by duty in the Pentagon as the senior military assistant to the Deputy Secretary of Defense. In 2017 Munsch reported to OPNAV N3/N5 as the assistant and in 2018 became the deputy chief of naval operations for operations, plans and strategy. In 2019 he established and served as the initial deputy chief of naval operations for warfighting development, N7. He assumed his role as director for joint force development (J7) in 2020.

My thanks to Stuart and his Aide-de-Camp LCDR Devin Laviano, USNA 2013, for making the trip and for taking the time to speak to the Class today. If you can spare an hour and some walking, join us for the meeting after the Memorial Service and before Mid Store Shopping.

(Thank you God), Class events on the Yard, the Supe's Brief at 1415-1530 at Mahan Hall and of course, the Class Cocktail/Dinner Party at the beautiful Fluegal Center tonight from 1745-2100.
